- Non-statutory Framework policy documents
- Strategic planning and management policy for 0-20, 20-50 and 50-100 year epochs
- Coastal erosion and flood risk management
- Coastal protection & flood defence engineering policy
- Economic appraisal
- Environmental assessments
- Communication and Consultation



## **Objectives of SMP**

- Define the flooding and erosion risks to people, and the developed, historic and natural environments
- Identify the preferred policies for managing those risks
- Identify consequences of implementing the preferred policies
- Inform others so future land use and coastal zone development can take account of the risks and the policies
- Comply with international and national nature conservation legislation and obligations
